## 7<sup>th</sup> Grade Course Offerings

### Required Courses

#### **English 7 Language Arts (40753/54)**

Full Year/ 1.0 Language Arts Credit  
(English, Reading, Spelling, Vocabulary, Word Processing, and Internet Usage). These classes focus on effective reading, writing, and communication skills. Students use writing strategies to create several writing projects including narrative, argument, research and poetry. In the computer lab students are given the opportunity to type essays and use software and the Internet for research. Independent reading programs and classroom novel studies are designed to reinforce important active reading strategies.

#### **English 7 Language Arts Honors (40760)**

Full Year/ 1.0 Language Arts Credit  
This honors class is open to students who are interested in excelling in reading and writing. The application will explain what is necessary to enroll in this class. Students must fill out an application.

#### **7th Grade Integrated Science (32003/04)**

Full Year/ 1. Science Credit  
This class integrates physical, earth, and life science concepts. Curriculum includes the particulate nature of matter, earth structure, cellular biology, heredity, and classification of living things according to structures and characteristics they have in common. \$5 fee required.

#### **Utah Studies (61002)**

½ Year/ .5 Social Studies Credit  
This class is designed to help students understand what their state is like and how it got to be that way. We will focus on Utah's geography, its government, and the changes in population, culture, and the economy from the Native Americans to the present including the impact of contemporary events in our state.

#### **Reading (40732)**

½ Year/ .5 Continuation of the Language Arts Credit with a focus on reading and writing

#### **7th Grade Mathematics (50403/04)**

Full Year/ 1.0 Mathematics Credit  
This class will study the following areas: Ratios and proportional relationships, the number system, expressions and equations, geometry, statistics, and probability.

#### **7th Grade Mathematics Honors (50413/14)**

Full Year/ 1.0 Mathematics Credit  
This class will study the following areas but will require additional applications and topics: Ratios and proportional relationships, the number system, expressions and equations, geometry, statistics, and probability.  
Current 6th grade teacher signature required.

#### **College and Career Awareness (80110)**

Full Year/ 1.0 CTE Credit  
Students will spend 60 days in each of the following areas: 1) a business setting: working with computers, adding machines, and learning business procedures; 2) a technology setting: learning about lasers, solar energy, hydraulics, robotics, etc.; and 3) a home living situation: studying cooking, nutrition, the family, sewing, and self-esteem. (Formally known as CTE Intro). \$20 fee required.

#### **Physical Education Boys-(77202) Girls-(77252)**

½ Year/ .5 PE Credit  
This class provides for physical growth and social interaction. Students are given the opportunities for participation in sports, intramural, and extracurricular activities, with emphasis placed on skill-building physical fitness skills for maintaining a healthy lifelong lifestyle and having fun.

### Elective Courses

#### **Orchestra 1 (17710)**

Full Year/ 1.0 Credit

Open to all students who want to learn Violin, Viola, Cello, or Bass for the first time. Students will learn to play their instrument, read music, and study introductory music theory. Students will participate in four annual concerts. This is a year-long class and a year-long commitment. Orchestra 1 prepares students to move on to Orchestra 2, 3, and orchestra at the high school level. Open to all grade levels. No experience required. \$10 fee required. Instrument rental fee applies to school instruments.

#### **Orchestra 2 (17720)**

Full Year/ 1.0 Credit

AUDITION REQUIRED

Open to string students with at least one year of experience. Students will improve their instrument technique, play more challenging music, study intermediate music theory, and participate in four annual concerts and other performance opportunities. This is a year-long class and a year-long commitment. Orchestra 2 prepares students to move on to Orchestra 3 and orchestra at the high school level. Teacher approval and \$10 fee required. Instrument rental fee applies to school instruments.

#### **General Music (16002)**

½ Year/ .5 Credit

This class is designed to give students a general overview of music through a variety of units. Topics may include the following: Music theory, note-reading, history of music, instruments, ear training, film music, world music, and playing recorders. Daily activities will involve anything from writing assignments to listening and moving to music.

#### **Band 1 (16730)**

Full Year/ 1.0 Credit

Open to students wanting to learn a wind or percussion instrument for the first time (flute, oboe, clarinet, bassoon, saxophone, trumpet, French horn, trombone, baritone, tuba, drums/mallets). Students will learn to read music as well as basic instrument technique. Band members are expected to practice their chosen instrument and improve in personal performance throughout the year. Students will participate in four annual concerts. Open to all grade levels. No experience required. \$10 fee required. Instrument rental fee may apply.

#### **Concert Band (16740)**

Full Year/ 1.0 Credit

AUDITION REQUIRED

Open to wind and percussion students with at least one year of experience. Students will improve their instrument technique, and play more challenging music. Members will be expected to continue progressing in instrument technique and abilities. The band will participate in four annual concerts and other performance opportunities. Teacher approval and \$10 fee required. Instrument rental fee may apply.

#### **Percussion (16834)**

Full Year/ 1.0 Credit

This class is you will hit stuff (with good technique of course)! Develop a solid foundation of percussion technique, including learning how to play mallet instruments, snare and other drums, timpani, and many other instruments found in the percussion family.

### Elective Courses

#### **Drama 1 (19502)**

½ Year/ .5 Credit

In this class, we will be focusing on the fundamentals of drama including voice, movement, and performance. There will be a class play at the end of the semester for family and friends to attend. \$10 participation fee required.

#### **Drama 2 (19602)**

½ Year/ .5 Credit

In this class we will review the fundamentals of theatre including things like theatre history, acting terminology, criticism, characterization, script analysis, and acting. There will be a class play at the end of the semester for family and friends to attend. \$10 participation fee required.

#### **Film Studies (11692)**

½ Year/ .5 Credit

Film Studies is a class for students who have a passion for film and film history. This class will be viewing some classic films from the original Dracula and Frankenstein to some favorites of today. Students will be required to watch the films, take notes and be prepared to write film critiques after each film.

#### **Chorus 1 (18710)**

Full Year/ 1.0 Credit

This class is an introductory choir course for students who have little to no experience in singing in an ensemble. Students will learn the basic musical skills including vocal technique, performance standards, and note reading during daily rehearsals. Students are required to participate in several concerts throughout the year. \$10 fee required.

#### **2- D Art (11932)**

½ Year/ .5 Credit

2D Art allows students to explore a variety of different materials and techniques, with focus placed on learning about Two Dimensional Design – working with flat images to create visual communications in Drawing, Painting, Printmaking, Commercial Design, and Advertising. Students will explore a variety of materials to work on flat imagery while learning Aesthetic Terminology – Being able to not only create, but know what makes a work of art successful and being able to describe the piece in oral and written communications.

#### **3-D Art (11942)**

½ Year/ .5 Credit

3D Art allows students to explore a variety of different materials and techniques, with focus placed on learning about Three Dimensional Design – working with sculptures to create visual communications in Subtractive and Additive Sculpture, Ceramics, Architecture, and Instillation. Students will explore a variety of materials to work on flat imagery while learning Aesthetic Terminology – Being able to not only create, but know what makes a work of art successful and being able to describe the piece in oral and written communications.

#### **Concert Choir (18780)**

Full Year/ 1.0 Credit

This class is an intermediate choir course for students who have taken Chorus 1 or have any previous choir experience and have mastered basic choral skills. Students will build on their prior knowledge and improve their musical skills during daily rehearsals. All students are required to participate in several concerts throughout the year. *Fee required \$10 fee, \$15 uniform rental.*

### Elective Courses

#### **Exploring Technology 1 (86302)**

½ Year/ .5 Credit

Exploring Technology 1 is a comprehensive action-based educational course that introduces students to technology and its impact on society. Students will develop problem-solving skills, improve awareness for College & Career Readiness (CCR), and build understanding of the relationship between science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM). Emphasis is placed on broad exploration in cooperative activities rather than individual skill development and projects. Students will explore Engineering, agriculture & biotechnology, energy & power, and information & communication.

#### **Intro to Foods & Sewing**

½ Year/ .5 Credit

This course introduces students to two of the most popular FACS classes, sewing and foods! This course covers sewing for one term and foods for one term. Students are introduced to the sewing machine & serger. They will use this equipment to make two projects. In the foods section, students learn how to keep food safe to eat and people safe while cooking. A variety of foods will be made. Join this class to have fun with foods and sewing!

#### **Animal Science (81752)**

½ Year/ .5 Credit

A one semester course that will cover basic animal sciences; students will discover all about the animal world. Topics that will be covered are: Companion animals, livestock, horses and much more. This course serves as a great foundation for advanced courses.

#### **Aerobic Conditioning- Girls (72652)**

½ Year/ .5 Credit

This class focuses on fitness concepts and an overall fitness/conditioning program to help students increase their fitness knowledge and levels. Students will be introduced to flexibility training, cardiovascular activities, and weight training. Fitness activities include (but not limited to): walking, distance running, sprinting, circuit training, plyometrics, speed and agility training, weight training, core training, yoga, and sports. If you want to become a better athlete, dancer, or just want to improve your overall health while having a fun time, then this class is for you!

#### **Body Conditioning- Boys (73512)**

½ Year/ .5 Credit

This class will study the muscular and cardiovascular systems. Students will develop a workable fitness plan with the help of their instructor. They will train on a variety of weight training and fitness equipment to build their muscular strength and cardiovascular endurance.
